NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 7TH FEBRUARY

The following information is taken from the Draft PC minutes and may be expanded where the Editors feel more explanation is necessary. The full official minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community website, once approved.

Councillors Present Were: Mrs. J. Borgnis (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips, Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. B. Gee, Mr. P. Grainger, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. J. Labouchere, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner and Mr. C. Smith.

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk) and one parishioner.

Updated Information and Matters Arising

Land Management Matters

Village Green: The Breckland Tree Officer had attended a meeting on site and said that he had the power to make a Tree Preservation Order. Guidance was duly given, however, and the contractor has confirmation of approval with an intention to commence work on 19th February, subject to the weather.

Cathedral Ruins: Mrs. Keeble reported that trees are in the process of being trimmed back.

Cathedral Meadows: Mr. Fitzalan Howard is to issue the annual grazing licence to Mr. Fish. One of the display maps has been wrenched off its base and Ruth Murray, who originally produced the item, is to be contacted.

Millennium Wood (and Jubilee Wood):

The fence around the pit has collapsed in the corner. Ben Darby is to be contacted with a view to repairing it. The gate to Boar's Hill has a gap at the bottom but the eventual height of the path will remedy the situation. The parishioner who requested to take the logs can do so (he will need to obtain the key from Mr. Fletcher for access). Proposed by Mr. Markwell and seconded by Mr. Phillips. All in favour.

Bridleway on Disused Railway Line and Other Railway Linked Matters: The level crossing gate has been damaged following a recent storm and is swinging freely. The MNR has been advised and a temporary repair has been carried out.

Church Meadow: Work on digging a soakaway is to start in the near future.

Allotments

Mr. Phillips is concerned with speeding traffic along the road next to the allotments and feels that a mirror is possibly needed. The Clerk mentioned that Fulmodeston and Barney Parish Council has a mirror which is not being used and will investigate the possibility of it being sold.

Street Lights

Mr. Markwell reported that T.T. Jones are to fit an interim light at the Eastgate Centre (cost \pm 48 + VAT) and this will remain until the repaired unit is returned by the manufacturer. There hasn't been any progress with the light at 29 Eastgate Street. Mr. Markwell will chase. Light number 103 is currently not working.

Highway Matters

Mr. Grainger said that a suggestion had been made to Highways for the existing bus stop to be moved to a position near the Surgery. Also, there were two possible locations for stops up the hill near the church. A request had been received from a parishioner for more yellow lines on Church Hill. It was agreed to wait until the new car park is in place so that an assessment of its impact can be made at that time. Mr. Labouchere mentioned a

blind spot, resulting from a traffic sign, that a parishioner had mentioned to him when turning from the Worthing Road onto the B1145 to Billingford. A number of members had used this junction and did not feel that there was an issue.

Pavilion and Playing Field

Miss Ferris mentioned the cracked windows and asked if new ones could be fitted. Mr. Smith is to obtain a quotation.

Brookside Development Update

The Chairman, together with Messrs Phillips and Rayner, are to meet the developers to discuss some items. A report will be made in due course.

Defibrillators

Pads become out of date on 24th February and are to be replaced.

Call for Sites Update: Breckland Council

Mr. Rayner had drafted a consultation response with the period due to end on 19th February. The Parish Council response is to be submitted via email. Mr. Rayner was thanked by all for his excellent work in producing this document. The drop-in session is now taking place in Dereham on 16th February.

Archive Group Records

Two quotations will be available for the next meeting. Mrs Woodhouse who stores all archive meeting in her home had asked for secure storage space to be made available, possibly in The Memorial Hall. A large cupboard was being considered.

CGM Group and Grounds Maintenance

The contract with CGM (Nurture) for 2024 has been agreed and is to be signed.

North Elmham Living Sustainably (NELS) Group

An advert has been placed in Elmham News.

S106 monies (£15.1K) received from Breckland Council

A concrete table tennis for the village green was considered (cost of up to £3K). The Chairman is to discuss with suppliers. A quotation for improved flooring is to be requested by Mr. Phillips. Further thought will be given to this matter at the next meeting.

CCTV Policy

Mr. Grainger had circulated a draft policy to members in advance of the meeting. He will also prepare a similar policy for the Eastgate Centre Trustees. The policy was approved by all. Proposed by Mr. Labouchere and seconded by Miss Ferris.


Request for a Grit Bin Near the North Elmham School

The Chairman has spoken to Mr. Nick Brown, Site Manager of Flourish Federation Norfolk. He will discuss the matter with Highways (Norfolk County Council).

Accounts

1. Concern has been expressed with the dramatic rise in the monthly direct debit to Npower in respect of the non-metered electricity supply for the streetlights from £235 in September, 2023 to £626 in February, 2024 (notification received). The Clerk will produce a detailed analysis showing how these amounts are calculated to enable possible action to be discussed with a view to taking steps to address this issue.

2. A representative from Biffa had visited and met with Mr. Smith. A significant improvement in the current terms had been offered. Full details of this and the terms of the current contract will be considered with a decision on the course of action to be decided at the next meeting.

i) 3PL/2023/0282/O – 55 Eastgate Street – appeal to the Secretary of State against the decision of Breckland District Council – outline planning application with all matters reserved for proposed dwelling and redevelopment of existing dwelling.

ii) TRE/2023/0353/TCA – pruning work at White House, 57 Holt Road – no objection.

 iii) 2 Keepers Cottage, Great Heath Road – Mr. Cooper – rear single storey extension with 1st floor ensuite extension. Replace existing septic tank with a treatment plant – 3PL/2023/1182/HOU – approved.

Mr. Rayner informed the parishioner that a request of this type would need to be directed to Breckland Council.

As far as I can remember the girls and boys stayed in dormitories at night.

On the first night, it eventually quietened down and I got into bed and thought I will read for a while. About 15 minutes later there was a knock on my door and I heard a sniffling noise so I got out to be confronted with one of the girls who had been brought by others saying 'Miss, she wont stop crying and we can't get to sleep. She will have to sleep with you!'

They stomped off!

I took the girl's hand and brought her into my room. She stopped crying and said 'I

have never slept with anyone except my sister... and I want to go home.'

I told her it would be a shame if she did leave as we had several days of fun on the beach and in the pine woods, as well as some work for school for when we went back. She then asked if she could sleep wrapped up in her duvet on the floor, beside me in bed.

So that was what she did for a couple of nights, then she said she would go back to her school friends to sleep the last night. A victory I thought.

I hoped she would remember that trip with affection, not fear. Sometimes we forget children can easily become overwhelmed and a few kind words is all that is needed to calm their fears.

COUNTY SCHOOL WATTS NAVAL TRAINING SCHOOL

About a year ago, my son in law saw a book for sale on E Bay, and knowing about my interest in County School, he managed to acquire it for me.

It was a personal book written, when grown up, by John Lucken, about his life as a youngster at the Barnardo's Home at County School and what happened after leaving. I hope he would not mind me dipping into his book and copying some of his personal pieces.

Watts Naval Training School, North Elmham, Norfolk 1934 – 1940

I was nine years old when I arrived from the Barnardo's home in London, with a label on a string around my neck saying that I was on my way to County School near North Elmham in Norfolk. It was a sign of the times that as a young boy, I could be sent from the Barnardo's home at Stepney Causeway to Liverpool Street Station in London and by myself be put on a train for Norwich, without anyone thinking that was anything other than normal. At Norwich Station I was met by an officer from the school, and we boarded a local train which took us to 'County School Station' which was the school's own railway station.

At the school I commenced my six year Naval Training before being drafted into the Royal Navy in 1940, shortly after my fifteenth birthday to serve as a Boy or Junior Seaman until I was eighteen and then went on to serve for a further twelve years until I was thirty years old.

The normal 'Rig of the Day' or clothing to be worn, in winter was blue serge suits and boots, in spring and summer the dress was shorts and shirt and bare feet. The latter was in order to toughen up the feet in preparation for ship – board or so we were told !

All boys at Watts were given numbers 1 to 300. For the whole time they were at the school they were known only by their numbers and not by their names.

The school provided the Royal Navy with about 50 trained boys each year as well as a few boys to the Army and the Royal Marines most of whom had been trained as musicians. My number was 182.

The boys were sub-divided into seven companies of about forty to forty five in each. They were named after famous Admirals, Jellicoe, Beatty, Sturdee, De Roebeck, Keys, Tywhitt, and Wilson

The school provided about 50 to 60 boys each year for the Navy and a few who were not accepted for the Navy would go to the Royal Marine School of Music to be drafted into the Royal Marines or the Army as Bandsmen. From Watts, most of them would go to the boys Royal Naval Establishment, HMS Ganges at Shotley near Harwich.

In 1939 the Captain, Commander and most of the reservists left for service in the Navy or Marines. This left the school with a skeleton staff which was partly made up by pensioners returning from civilian life and outside volunteers.

The school was blacked out, which meant that in addition to curtains, every night screens were placed over the large sky lights in the centre of the school, over the area designated as the quarter deck.

As the school passed into the middle days of 1939, preparation for war was well in hand.

OUR 25 YEAR CAREER WITH THE YHA

People

Our main business in the Hostel were groups of one sort or another, mainly school parties.

We catered for these groups, breakfast, lunch packs and evening meals. On one occasion I noticed that one girl, aged about 10, was not eating at all on the first night, ate a little on the second night, and almost everything on the third. I said to her that it seemed that her appetite was improving. She replied that she had never eaten with other people before. She obviously ate in front of the TV with no contact with others. Something I had never thought of, but, at least, having a residential experience with the school party, in our hostel, introduced her to social life, and that perhaps we had done a bit of good in one case, at least.

One night, about 3 am our daughter was awakened by knocking on the back door. She went to see what was occurring. She saw through the glass windows in the door, a figure dressed in white, with blood on her hands. To her credit, our daughter overcame her natural fear and opened the door, to find that it was a 10 year old member of the school party that was staying with us. It transpired, after everyone had calmed down, that this child, in her sleep, had got up, moved a suitcase off the window sill, opened the sash window, and had climbed out. An oddity of the building is that, being on a hill, what is the first floor on hill side, is second floor on the other, or river, side. The little girl, as luck would have it, was in a room on the hill side, in other words, on the first floor. Also, as luck would have it, below the window in guestion, was a neatly stacked pile of wooden planks, with a sheet of corrugated tin covering it. The girl, therefore, only fell about 4 feet,

bounced off the pile, and rolled another 4 feet or so to land on the ground. The only injury being a grazed hand, hence the blood. Had she been in a room on the other side, she would have fallen two floors. In addition to that she would have hit the wrought iron balustrade of a balcony that runs across the front of the building. She would almost certainly have been killed, or at least severely injured. When the teacher in charge of the party, full of trepidation, informed the child's parents, she was told that the child frequently walked in her sleep. All parents are given a form to complete before a school outing, so why this wasn't highlighted, we have no idea. The upshot was that all sash windows in the YHA have to be blocked so that they can only be opened 6 inches or so.

To end on a lighter note. One of the first bookings I dealt with was for a Mr. P. Podd. It's amazing what names some parents give their children. Mind you, I once came across a Mr and Mrs Bull who named their child Terry.

ELMHAM WILDLIFE

As I was thinking about what to write about this month I received a couple of messages from friends saying that they were seeing or hearing migrant Chiffchaffs arriving, so I decided to write about North Elmham's migrant warblers. Chiffchaffs are the earliest of our warblers to arrive each spring and can be heard almost anywhere where there are trees, belting out their "chiff-chiff-chiff-chiffchaff" song (or some variation of that). They start appearing during March and most of the birds that breed round here should have arrived by the time you read this.

Chiffchaffs are sprightly birds that tend to sing fairly high up in the trees so they aren't easy to observe, though the benefit (to us) of them arriving so early in the spring is that there aren't too many leaves on the trees for them to hide behind. They do come lower down and when you do get a good view you will see they are a dull greeny-brown colour with an indistinct pale stripe over the eye, a pale eye-ring, dark legs and short wings (photo 1).

Chiffchaffs can be really hard to tell from Willow Warblers if they're not singing. Willow Warblers can be brighter (but aren't always), have slightly longer wings, paler legs, and they tend to have a less distinct pale eyering and cleaner cheeks (photo 2). By far the easiest way to tell them apart is their song, a beautiful descending warble, guite different from the harsh staccato sounds of the Chiffchaff (although just to make matters difficult, they do occasionally sing more like Chiffchaffs). Their other calls are similar to those of Chiffchaff, a soft "hueet", but more clearly disyllabic than Chiffchaff. The first Willow Warbler can arrive at the end of March, but early April is more typical. Sadly they are much less common now than they were a decade or two ago.

Blackcap is also among the first of the summer visiting warblers to arrive, with the











majority arriving in early April. They have a more thrush-like warble. The males (the only sex that sings) have a black cap (photo 3), hence the name, but females have a chestnut cap. Either way this makes them visually one of our easiest warblers to identify.

Arriving at around the same time is Sedge Warbler (photo 4). Like the Willow Warblers and all the species that arrive later, these will have most likely overwintered in Africa. Sedge Warbler is found in damper areas, along the river valley in North Elmham. They have a long scratchy song and are visually distinctive with buff colours, streaked on the back and with a very clear pale stripe over the eye. I don't seem to have taken any good photos in the parish yet, so I've used one from elsewhere – and that is also the case with the next warbler to arrive, Reed Warbler (photo 5).

Reed Warblers arrive in April and usually frequent reedbeds. They look like much plainer versions of Sedge Warbler, and they sound like that too – their song being long and scratchy but more constant, lacking the high notes that Sedge Warbler throws in now and then.

Grasshopper Warbler (photo 6) is rarer (and declining) but I occasionally see or hear them in the parish. They're likely to sing from bramble thickets or willow scrub in damp areas, and unless you're lucky or patient you won't see them. Their song is very distinctive though: a long reeling sound that is a bit like certain grasshoppers or perhaps more like an angler's fishing reel. They can sing overnight or early morning but you're less likely to hear them by the time most of us are up and about. Sometimes they start singing again in the evening, so it isn't always necessary to be up at the crack of dawn to hear them (but I recommend it dawn is the best time to hear warblers as well as most of our other songbirds).

A much easier warbler to see is Whitethroat. They're common around the parish, usually in scrub or hedgerows. They have a rambling scratchy song, often delivered from a relatively prominent perch and sometimes in flight. They arrive here in the second half of April usually but are getting earlier. I'm not guite old enough to remember this, but in 1969 Whitethroats failed to return from Africa, or at least most of them did. At first I'm told it was a disturbing mystery where had they gone? It turned out that there had been a drought in the Sahel, where they overwinter, and perhaps 80% of the population had died. It was one of the first indications of how our wildlife can be affected by climatic conditions somewhere else in the world. Since then of course things have got a lot worse, perhaps not for Whitethroats so much, whose population has now largely recovered, but for many of our other long distance migrants that are





undergoing long-term and catastrophic decline as a result of our changing climate.

On a Whitethroat (photo 7), as well as its white throat, notice the rusty-brown wings and pale legs. The slightly more diminutive Lesser Whitethroat (photo 8) has plainer greyer-brown upperparts, grey legs and a shorter grey bill. They're also more elusive that Whitethroats – sometimes the only way you know they've arrived back from Africa safely is when you hear their distinctive rattling song clattering out of a thick dense Hawthorn hedge.

Usually the last of the warblers to visit us in the summer is the Garden Warbler. These used to arrive in the first half of May, but early arrivals can be in April nowadays. Garden Warblers are shy birds that tend to hide deep in scrub. If you do see one it's a plain brown bird with a slightly greyer shawl and a beady black eye (photo 9). But if their appearance might be considered drab (I prefer subtle) there is nothing dull about its song: a sweet melodious warble, quite similar to that of a Blackcap but not so harsh and lasting longer. Some people describe it as sounding like running water.

Like many of our birds, it's often easier to find warblers by listening out for them than it is by looking for them with just your eyes. So when you're outside, keep an ear out for what you can hear. If you're interested to know what's singing and can't work it out for yourself, then I recommend downloading the Merlin Bird ID app on your smartphone – so long as the sound is reasonably clear this does a pretty good job of identifying birds. You can't totally rely on it as it does make mistakes, but I've been pretty impressed with its accuracy when I've tried it.



Welcome to Eastertide

Eastertide officially started on the last day of March, Easter Sunday, and lasts for 50 days and is a time for celebrating Jesus' resurrection.
