Elmham News AN UPDATE

Dear Readers.

For the first time in our long 48 year history, Elmham News is facing a financial crisis which we feel obliged to share with you in the hope that you can help us solve it. Thankfully, it is not due to mismanagement but rather is due to the growth of our village and increased costs.

As many of you will know, we started printing the magazine on an old Gestetner machine (Google that!) that lived in the church vestry or the Vicarage study. It was typed and then printed by hand before given to volunteers who collated each magazine, by hand and individual sheet by individual sheet before being stapled and delivered.

Since then, we have come a long way, becoming more and more professional in our approach and in 2022 won the prestigious award of the Best A5 Magazine in the country! Something we are very proud of.

Today, we print 800 magazines and deliver to every house in North Elmham, Broom Green, Billingford and Worthing for no charge. Paid advertising by local businesses has covered our costs and we suggest small donations from local groups when they place event adverts (some do, some don't).

The Elmham News has also been lucky enough to give back to the village over the years funding noticeboards, planting daffodil bulbs, and holding various "Thank You Celebrations" for our wonderful team of deliverers and contributors. To our delight, we were able to have all the copies of the magazine over the last 48 years, professionally bound for posterity, a real legacy for the village and part of the archives.

But... over the last five years we have also been dealing with a number of issues.

- Printing costs have risen by 35%.
- Advertising income has fallen by 23%, mainly due to the growth of the internet and social media such as Facebook etc. The need for businesses to use us to advertise their wares has waned somewhat though we still have an exceptional core of advertisers.
- North Elmham is a growing village and the numbers of houses to whom we deliver has increased by over 20%, thus increasing our print run and subsequent costs.

There are those splendid folk in North Elmham who do give us donations because they love to read the News and those who give a little and often, plus some organisations donate as a thank you for printing their news and keeping everyone informed as to what's on BUT SADLY, IT'S NOT QUITE ENOUGH! Each magazine costs roughly £1 to produce.

To resolve our immediate problem, we have taken the tough decision to stop delivering to Billingford and in future, we may have to consider not delivering to Worthing and to holiday homes.

If you are holding a fundraising event for your club or organisation and place a colour advert in the magazine, please consider a donation to the News out of your proceeds.

We will keep you updated on our progress. Thank you, as always, for your support.

NORTH ELMHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

WEDNESDAY 2ND APRIL, 2025

The following information is taken from the Draft PC minutes and may be expanded where the Editors feel more explanation is necessary. The full official minutes and the March meeting minutes can be viewed in the Post Office and on the Community website, once approved.

Councillors Present Were: Mr. P. Grainger (Chairman), Mr. M. Phillips (Vice Chairman), Miss A. Ferris, Mr. T. Fitzalan Howard, Mr. B. Gee, Mr. F. Gillespie, Mrs. A. Keeble, Mr. N. Markwell, Mr. M. Rayner, Mr. C. Smith and Mr. J. Sowinski.

Also in Attendance: Mr. K. Webb (Clerk), Mr. G. Bambridge (District Councillor) and two parishioners.

Public Participation

a) A parishioner asked if bin lorries were assessing 'phone coverage capacity' and, if this is so, how will the District Council use the data. Mr. Bambridge said that he was unaware of this particular news but a certain amount of money had been

previously allocated (about £950K) with an aim of improving services. The mast in North Elmham is a 02 mast and the experience of parishioners, in general, was that it is of very little use to the mobile 'phone users of other companies.

b) Dr. Peter Wade-Martins stressed that he was attending as the church Fabric Officer and not as a member of the Parochial Church Council. The Parish Council had previously challenged the grounds for closure (minutes 5th March, 2025, item 312) but Dr. Wade-Martins gave his views on the various matters raised involving headstones, walls and trees. He suggested that a further meeting should be held between the Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council.

Updated Information And Matters Arising

Land Management Matters

Village Green: It is planned for the piece of equipment known as the camel to be returned to the Play Area. It probably requires a concrete pad and it will need to be established that any arrangement satisfies Health and Safety rules. Quotations are to be obtained for any necessary work.

Mr. Rayner had noticed that grass is coming through the safe areas which were laid about a year ago. The grass has recently been cut on both the Village Green and the Play Area. It has been noted that this grounds maintenance work is of a good standard. Mr. Gee reported that some young children appear to be building a den.

Broom Green: The state of the pond is to be monitored.

Millennium Wood (and Jubilee Wood):

Mr. Sowinski reported that the gate into the wood is broken. Five more trees have been cut down and he is shortly to meet with the contractor regarding replacement fencing. There is a small fence in front of

the bigger fence. There is a problem with deer tending to jump over it and getting stuck between the two. It was agreed to remove the small fence. In addition, the squares making up the fence are rather large and there have been occasions where deer have caught their heads in the fence.

Prince William Wood: Mr. Markwell reported that a dead tree, (approximately 50 feet high),had fallen against another tree. A contractor is to examine this and recommend the best course of action. In addition, all other trees are to be looked at.

Allotments

Mr. Phillips said that there are a number of potholes and there is the intention of levelling the surface.

Highway Matters

There has been no further news regarding the temporary bus stop near the County School Station junction. As previously reported, the Parish Partnership road safety application for £15,668 has been successful (Parish Council/Norfolk County Council 50% contribution each). There appears to be a dispute regarding a road sign on the Station Road development and the ownership of the land on which it is planned to be placed. It is believed that the District Council may well be dealing with this matter.

Pavilion and Playing Field

A window in the pavilion has been smashed. A new piece of polycarbonate has been purchased and is to be fitted. Breckland Council have expressed a desire to take on the contract for the trade waste bin. It was agreed by all to retain the current arrangement with Biffa as the costs indicated by both the service providers are very similar. The wage rate of the pavilion cleaner is to be increased from £11.44 to £12.21 per hour in accordance with statutory requirements. The volunteers are to repaint the bus shelter, using anti-graffiti paint. The cost, including the ceiling, will

be in the region of £305 (including VAT). Proposed by Mr. Phillips and seconded by Mr. Smith. All in favour.

The flint wall, built in the 1840's, at the top of the Playing Field has been vandalised. A month ago, a small hole appeared. This has now grown to an opening measuring some four feet by four feet. It is estimated that the cost to repair the damage will be in the region of £3K to £4K. It is suggested that some Heras fencing should be erected on the Parish Council land in front of it. A distance of some twenty metres would be needed at a cost of £724 plus VAT. It was also suggested that the possibility of CCTV cameras being installed in the tennis courts area should be investigated. Mr. Smith proposed that the Heras fencing should be installed to assist in securing the area and maintaining the safety of any parishioners finding themselves in this part of the Playing Field, and to explore the possibility of providing CCTV cameras. Seconded by Miss Ferris. All in favour except Mr. Fitzalan Howard who abstained. The Chairman is to ask officials of the Tennis Club if they would like to consider a joint approach with cameras.

Brookside Development Update

Tom Binks of Orchard Homes has sent an e-mail advising that the car park and Eon electric meter will be handed over in the near future. The contract for signing should be available in a few days.

Orchard Homes has concern that there are no fences either side of the bridge over the stream. The school wants the bridge to be opened as soon as possible. Therefore, a quotation for a basic post and rail fence, covering two metres either side of the bridge, will be obtained. A parishioner has again queried the position regarding trees in the Millennium Wood next to the property. It is acknowledged, and advice will be given, that there is a right to trim or cut any overhanging branches from adjoining land, but only up

to the property boundary. The agreement to place a dog waste bin in the new car park will also be confirmed.

North Elmham Living Sustainably (NELS) Group

All members had read the report with interest. It was generally agreed that some benefit may be forthcoming if a slightly more concentrated focus on the aims of the paper could be demonstrated.

Mr. Fitzalan Howard is to liaise with the author.

New Village Hall

An architect valuer visited and viewed the buildings. He stated that the fabric of the Pavilion is basically sound. The Eastgate Centre and Memorial Hall are candidates for commercial development. The next meeting of the committee is to take place on 28th April. Mr. Sowinski is to arrange dates for visits to be made to other halls previously detailed.

The Future of the Churchyard

Please refer to Public Participation.

Mr. Rayner felt that paragraph 5 of the Ministry of Justice guidance notes, relating to the closure of part of a church yard, had not been properly addressed. It will be necessary to seek the view of Breckland Council before progress can be made.

Parish Waste Bins

Please refer to mention in Brookside Development.

North Elmham Football Club Facilities

The Chairman of the Football Club, Stuart Darbyshire, said that the preferred method of providing improved facilities, should promotion to a higher league, (the Anglian Combination), be achieved, is to extend the building. It is estimated that this will cost about £20K and grants up to £15K are apparently available. The original floor plans are needed, and the Chairman has given these to Mr. Darbyshire who will

take a copy and return the originals. From a cost perspective, it is better to retain the existing space and not extend. There is, however, a desire from the Football Club to extend outwards with the aim of funding the project themselves. The Parish Council may be approached, at some stage, for assistance although the majority of the funding will come from grants.

Roles for Parish Council Members

It was agreed to carry this matter forward to the next meeting.

Reports from District and County Councillors

These are printed in full on the Community Website if you would like to read them or in the Parish Council Minutes in the Post Office.

Mr. Bambridge stressed the dangers presented by the very important matter of floating pennywort which is present in the Broom Green pond. It is a highly invasive plant which is a real problem for waterways. Help is available from the Drainage Board. It is recommended that dead trees are left and not removed, unless they represent a risk to safety.

In the coming months, we will continue welding on the anti-tip rails, install fencing and aim to complete the turntable, ready for use on 11th May (Bus Day). When completed, the 3.5 and 5-inch gauge raised track will run for a third of a mile along the route once occupied by the Great Eastern Railway branch line that ran from Dereham to Wroxham via Reepham.

We hope that income generated from public operations in 2025 will help fund the construction of a station canopy and allow us to 'Raise the Roof'. Money from our plastic bread bag recycling initiative will also contribute to our funding.

Working together with MNR volunteers, we help to keep County School looking its best—cutting the grass, tending the gardens, and repairing seats and picnic benches, all to make it a welcoming experience for visitors.

We look forward to seeing you soon! A list of our running dates can be found on our Facebook page, Wensum Valley Miniature Railway, along with information updates.

Plastic-only bread bags can be delivered on Thursdays and Sundays to the Miniature Railway. No need to wash them—just shake out the crumbs!

MILK N METAL

Reading a letter in a magazine about milk and where it comes from, sent me into a reverie of childhood days here in mid Norfolk.

Living on a mixed farm as a young child at the end of the war, with a father who was a cowman. I certainly knew where milk came from and where it went.

I vividly remember that just about every farm, however small had a dairy herd. The milk from the cows was pumped into milk churns and taken to the end of the farm track to be collected. Those churns were put up onto platforms about three or four feet high. The platforms were to make it easier for the driver of the lorry to collect the heavy churns without having to lift them.

Here in the village we had a haulage business called Mickleover Transport Ltd, in Eastgate Street, which collected the milk from far and wide, and took it to Elmham station to a United Dairies depot which processed the milk. Then it was pumped into tankers and sent by rail to Ilford.

The beds of the lorries that Mickleover Transport used to collect the milk in churns from the farms were wooden and were being heavily gouged by the full metal churns and so a sheet of aluminium was put on top of the wood to protect it.

In 1951 the clock on St Mary's church in the village was in a sad state of repair and a local parishioner contacted Mickleover Transport Ltd with a tale of woe about the clock, which in turn enlisted the help of the Northern Aluminium Co. This company had supplied the metal for the beds of the lorries.

The Northern Aluminium Company gifted to the church an aluminium clock face, anodised gold to harmonise with the stonework. It took nine men to hoist the face into position and included the vicar, the landlord of the Kings Head and the village policeman, a good community effort!

ELMHAM WILDLIFE







As this is the May issue of the magazine I thought I'd write about Cockchafers – Cockchafers are most active in May and are often known as maybugs (although they are beetles, not bugs in the strictest sense of the word). Some people call them doodlebugs though I'm not sure why.



Cockchafers (photo 1) don't have the best reputation and certainly don't rate as among our most admired wildlife, but they are fascinating insects and deserve more credit. I think the similarity of their name to that of the cockroaches may have led to some of the bad press associated with cockroaches being accidentally transferred to Cockchafers. Cockroaches are an entirely different group of insects that have little in common with Cockchafers.



One distinctive feature of Cockchafers is their fan-like antennae. The fans can be spread out (photo 2) or, when the beetle is relaxed, closed together (photo 3). They have quite furry bodies and viewed from the side (photo 4) they have white triangles down the side.

Cockchafers are easily attracted to light. This means that people like me who use light to find moths also get to see a lot of Cockchafers. They can be a bit of a nuisance in the moth trap, especially if you catch a lot of them, as they crash around disturbing the moths that you're wanting to look at. Some moth trappers call them blunderbugs because of this habit. Another consequence of them being attracted to light is that they sometimes come to lighted windows.

Some people can be scared of Cockchafers if they do come indoors







through an open window. They're quite big for beetles, up to 3cm long, and robustly-built. As clumsy and noisy fliers they buzz around crashing into things which can be quite off-putting. But they're not dangerous at all – they don't bite or sting. They do have a pointed 'tail' (correctly called a pygidium) but this does not contain any sting and I don't believe it is ever used to attack people or other animals, even defensively. The only slight discomfort you might receive from one is if it accidentally flies into you but that's really nothing worse than a mild nuisance. There are stories of them of them getting tangled up in people's hair but I suspect most of these are greatly exaggerated.

As with most beetle species, in normal resting posture the wings are held hidden beneath the "elytra" or wing cases. Hardened wing cases are a feature of most beetles that makes them almost unique among insects. Really the elytra are a second pair of wings, modified to become hard structures that are not used for flying but for protection. The elytra effectively act as shields to protect the wings and soft body of the beetle – and can be remarkably effective at doing so, being able to bear quite a bit of force before they break.

The actual wings of beetles are very flimsy membranous structures that are folded up and kept out of sight beneath the elytra. When the beetle wants to fly it lifts up the elytra and stretches the wings out as it takes off. There is just enough strength in the veins of the wing to give the wings enough rigidity to fly with. A Cockchafer's wing (photo 5) has the thickest veins I've seen in any beetle wings, presumably because the wings need to be stronger to keep such a heavy beetle airborne.

Because beetles are such poor flyers and clumsy when they try to fly, they often land upside down (photo 6). They can struggle to right



themselves when this happens, especially if they can't push up against anything, and they spin round on their backs as they try.

Cockchafers lay their eggs 15-20cm deep in the ground and when the larvae hatch they eat the roots of various plants. In some situations they can be regarded as a pest because when there are large numbers they can damage crops, but usually they do not cause any significant problems. The beetle larvae live underground for three years until they are ready to pupate, now at a depth of about 1m. About six weeks later the adult beetle emerges and spends its first winter underground. In the spring it digs its way out of the ground and the males start to fly around looking for females to mate with. This is usually the only time we see them before the females lay eggs and the lifecycle starts again.

Cockchafers are one species among a group of beetles known as chafers. The one that looks most similar to Cockchafer is the Summer Chafer (photo 7). These fly later in the year (I see them in June and July) and are a little smaller than Cockchafers, more uniformly brown in colour and lacking the pointed tail.

The other species of chafer you are likely to see in North Elmham is the Garden Chafer. These are much smaller and don't readily come to light at night (so you're less likely to find one indoors) but can often be found in grass or on wildflowers on sunny days. These have blackish foreparts which look metallic green if you catch them in the right light (photo 8) and dark reddish-brown wing-cases.

About the NHS App

WIVES PLUS ALL

At April's evening meeting of Wives Plus All on Thursday 10th April in the Memorial Hall, Tim Fisher from Norfolk's River Trust came to speak to members and gave a very interesting, illustrated talk on "Why is Norfolk's Water Precious".

It is said that England's driest and flattest county is Norfolk and the 'swells' of the terrain that inhabitants call 'hills' in Norfolk, shelter over a dozen spring fed chalk streams, such as the Rivers Wissey, Glaven, Babingley, Gaywood, and Stiffkey. The longest, biggest and most significant river is the River Wensum which is the most protected in Europe as it is a site of Special Scientific Interest. Chalk streams are unique in the southern part of England where there are rolling hills and valleys but in Norfolk they rise from springs in the landscape of woods and water meadows.

Norfolk's distinctive spring fed Chalk Stream Jewels are rivers built on and created from billions and billions of microscopic single cell sea creatures called Coccoliths which rained down through prehistoric oceans and the streams are fertile homes for birds, plants, insects, mammals and fish.

Norfolk Rivers Trust is currently working with the Environment Agency and are creating channels next to the Chalk Streams such as the River Stiffkey. Their aim is to restore, protect and enhance the water environment and surrounding habitat and wildlife.

Thanks go to Tim for a very enlightening talk.

May's monthly meeting will be on THURSDAY 8th MAY 2025 at 7.30 pm in the Memorial Hall, North Elmham. There will be a talk and video by a Representative of Redwings entitled "Behind the Scenes at Redwings Horse Sanctuary". There will also be refreshments and a raffle All Welcome.

SCHOOL LOG BOOKS

Here are some interesting snippets to share with you about our village school. I don't think the young of today would have relished life in the mid 1800's. My notes are in brackets.

30th September 1864

There appears very little hope of a full school for some long time as the Smallpox is still raging (remember this was when children knew their place, never mind they were dying; why weren't they all at school?).

31st March 1865

There are several children away on account of barley sowing (All hands to the pump).

28th May 1866

Mrs Calver came blowing up for punishing her boy for truanting – referred her to Rev Davies (The vicar played a large part in the village school life).

10th December 1866

Still at work at Long Division, not one can do a sum yet after eight lessons.

26th October 1868

Numbers away again today, owing to measles and acorns. This is the 5th week of the acorn season (Acorns were free fodder for pigs. Many cottages had a pig in a pen in the garden).

9th November 1868

Numbers away, owing to measles, mumps and potatoes (Potatoes illness! Potato picking was another essential job that children had to do).

15th February 1869

Sent William Cook home for going to Chapel on Sundays (Elmham school was a church school, so going to the Chapel on a Sunday was a definite no-no).

6th- 7th April 1869

Elmham Fair – 2 days holiday (Elmham had an annual fair in the 1800's. In one of the Census returns these travelling folk are listed as being on the Park).

26th April 1869

A girl unruly – sent her home until I could speak to her parents (wonder what they said – or did).

23rd September 1870

Thin attendance – wild beast show at Dereham.

31st March 1873

Admitted several children belonging to workmen of the wandering class employed at the building of the County School Station; all of them in a deplorable state of ignorance, a very unsatisfactory addition to the school (Poor little things, don't your hearts bleed for them. Families belonging to these workmen were travelling all around the countryside as the men were building railways and roads. What chance did these youngsters have when they only spent a few weeks or months in any one place).

14th April 1873

Visit of the Prince and Princess of Wales to Elmham (This Royal party came to County School. The Prince of Wales came to lay the Foundation Stone of this new school which was to be a school for gentlemen farmer's sons. This was not successful and by the early 1900's the school became the Watts Naval School, a Barnado's home for boys, many of whom went on to join the Navy).

22nd March 1875

Have been trying to cultivate the intelligence of Standard V and VI, particularly in Arithmetic the last two or three weeks, but the material does not seem capable of improvement – the stream gets muddier the more you stir it up (Can't you imagine those poor children, the girls in their smocks and the boys in short trousers and all of them wearing boots, chewing the ends of those awful dip in the ink, pens, as they struggled with Arithmetic).

8th May 1876

Many boys away on allotments, crow keeping and sheep washing.

29th October 1877

Several children returned to school in consequence of the Attendance Officer visiting the parents.

31st July 1879

Attendance only moderate on account of hay making and turnip picking.

22nd September 1879

Gave another weeks holiday on account of the harvest not being finished and the prevalence of Measles in the Parish.

13th December 1880

Two children died of Scarletina and more cases reported. James Copling at school last Wednesday was buried yesterday, and his sister died this morning – general panic in the village (I wonder how this Headmaster really felt, not much compassion here I think. The school was closed until after the Christmas holidays).

6th February 1888

Great improvement in attendance. Four of the parents fined by the Magistrates at Dereham last Friday.

19th March 1888

Hard frost and high winds. Thin attendance on account of stick gathering. There is always some excuse or other for irregularity in the country (Would this Head have been happier in a city, I suspect there would have been truancy that he would have railed against).

21st November 1890

Mr William James Pearson, son of the Master, formerly a pupil teacher at this school, died on Tuesday 18th of at the age of 20 From Consumption.

Deeply lamented by all who knew him.

7th May 1894

William Melton died of Diptheria. Two more children of the Melton family died during the last week, 21st May.

29th November 1897

Great storm on Monday, only 68 present in the morning.

Weather considered too bad to send children to school but not too bad for some to go gathering the fallen branches.

19th September 1898

The new vicar Rev. EH Townsend visited the school on Monday afternoon (The Rev Townsend by all accounts was a kindly soul and was our vicar until 1946. He is bur-ied to the left of the church gate).

21st January 1901

A great many away net keeping on Thursday. This is the fourth time this season. They were away also on Friday (Nets were used when game was being shot .Not sure exactly how this worked).

9th October 1901

On Wednesday the 9th at 3pm, General Baden-Powell, the illustrious defender of Mafeking who is staying at Elmham Hall, visited the school accompanied by the Vicar, Mrs Wilson and two other ladies.

2nd June 1902

News of the conclusion of peace in South Africa arrived this morning June 2nd at 8.30.

16th June 1902

Coronation mugs presented to the children by Mr Wilson, distributed by the Vicar at the Vicarage after school on Friday afternoon.

27th June 1902

Coronation postponed on account of His Majesty's sudden illness.

13th March 1903

Some children away with Ringworm.

30th September 1903

On September 30th the school was taken over by the Local Authority.

ST MARY'S CHURCH

Dear Friends,

May, the last month of Spring heralds the oncoming summer. Its name comes from the Latin Maius, probably referring to the goddess Maia. She embodied the concept of growth, both in nature and in business.

Being in nature has been part of my life for some time. In the late 1980s /early 90s I was a conservation volunteer and my OU science degree centred around biology and ecology.

To me respect for nature both flora and fauna is a fundamental part of my life and also part of my faith. As a follower of Christ I firmly believe that part of my faith includes caring for all God's creation. For many centuries the church preached a human centric attitude towards the world about us. It placed humanity at the top of the creation web of life and its


